It was a quite small and old apartment house. Even though we all family were satisfied with it I was looking for another place for not only my family but also myself where I could enjoy ham radio with big antennas.

Miura was our favorite place by my family. With a lot of nature, beautiful sea, delicious seafood and vegetables, and good air. We enjoyed driving tour there from Yokohama by a compact size car almost every weekend and were fascinated by the place more day by day. Here, Miura has very strong wind especially in winter as it locates on the edge of peninsula and I decided to construct a crank-up typed tower to reduce negative impact by wind.



I asked a professional firm to construct a tower and a lot of friends including FISTS members came to see how a tower was built up on the day. They helped me so much and I appreciated it very much. Now I'm so happy with this new system. The only problem is that I cannot find enough time to operate radio. I, however, really enjoy talking in CW with some of FISTS members in weekend.
